Will you help plan your future?

Market Lavington needs to provide a considerable number of new homes over the next decade – probably more than 100, once the Government's new housing targets have been included (which will be made clear early in the new year).

Growth is important for the parish. The number of people living in Market Lavington has dropped more than 10% over the last 20 years. Well planned and well built new housing for everyone should be good news for the village – it means more people to support our shops and schools and maintain a lively community.

HOW WE'RE PREPARING FOR THE NEXT 14 YEARS

The new Neighbourhood Plan will identify where *we* in the village believe new housing is best sited through to 2038, what mix is needed (size, affordability and impact on existing housing) and how the village can best accommodate the increase.

We must also identify changes needed to cope with the increased number of homes – including transport, footpaths, sewage, ground-water, flood risk etc. We must set out our expectations for sustainably built homes, well designed to suit the character of the village. We want to identify where more local employment can be encouraged. And we want to identify new green spaces that can help enhance the natural environment.

If the Plan is approved by Wiltshire Council and in a parish referendum, future planning applications will need to demonstrate compliance with its policies.

Joseph, a carpenter from Nazareth was considering breaking off his engagement to Mary. She was pregnant. And he wasn't the father. According to Matthew's Gospel, the angel of the Lord appeared to Jospeh in a dream to convince him to go through with the marriage. The heavenly visitor told the carpenter, 'do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.' As the Lord had spoken by Isaiah the prophet, "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel." The name given to Jesus by ancient prophecy tells us something about his unique identity and mission.

God with us

Matthew explains that Emmanuel means, 'God with us'. Christians believe that the baby boy who was born in Bethlehem and laid in a manger was God in human form. Now, that's an awesome claim. We might perhaps expect that God would do God-like stuff, like create the universe to display his wisdom, power and goodness. But would the Creator of heaven and earth stoop to enter our world as man? The New Testament insists that he did. Jesus is the Son of God, fully divine in every way. Yet he became human. He is Emmanuel, God with us as one of us.

God for us

The angel of the Lord also instructed Jospeh that Mary's son was to be named Jesus. Once more, a word of explanation is given, "for he will save his people from their sins". Jesus is the Greek version of the Hebrew name Joshua, which means 'the Lord saves'. That is the reason why God became man, to rescue us from sin and death. Christ, who was without sin, died in our place on the cross that we may be forgiven. As Paul affirms, 'God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.'

God in us

Matthew concludes his Gospel by telling us that Jesus rose from the dead and appeared to his disciples. The final words of the risen Lord to his followers in Mathew's account are, "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.' Jesus ascended to heaven, having completed the work of salvation. He then poured out the Holy Spirit upon the church on the Day of Pentecost. Christ dwells in his people by the power of the Spirit. His presence in the lives of his followers now is the pledge of greater things to come, 'Christ in you, the hope of glory'. Jesus became Emmanuel, God with us so that those who believe in him may be with God for ever.




"Christmas Ghosts: The Tradition Of Winter Tales"

Nurture Nature

Referring to a recent Nurture Nature article on crows, a current news item states that crows can hold grudges against humans, who have harmed family members, for up to seventeen years. The dramatic sea cliffs, crags and stacks of Rathlin Island, county Antrim, rise more than 200 metres above the Atlantic Ocean and host one of the UK's largest seabird colonies, including hundreds of puffins. From September, when the puffins have left to spend the winter at sea, skilled teams started culling the Island's predators, as the final phase of a project to protect puffins. In the first phase ferrets were targeted and none has been seen for a year. Puffin numbers had declined by 74% between 1991 and 2021. This initiative is a Life Raft Project led by a partnership with the RSPB Northern Ireland and the local community. The traps are baited but scientifically designed to keep out non targeted species. This control scheme is necessary to enable the sea birds, especially puffins and their young, to survive. A recent Kew Gardens report concluded that a third of the world's tree species could be wiped out due to climate change and other environmental negatives. Species such as the whitebeam, spindle, hawthorn, and in Scotland the aspen. Trees are essential for wildlife. Spring blossom provides nectar for pollinators and the leaves are a food source for a range of insects, including caterpillars, leafhoppers and beetles. The berries attract a range of bird species for food in the autumn and winter including migrants, mainly from Scandinavia. Although one is unlikely to spot a Scarlet Tanager on their washing line as the one recently seen in a Yorkshire garden, which has attracted hundreds of twitchers. This bird is a resident of the eastern seaboard of America, weighing approximately 30 grams and blown off course in the recent gales. Bird Life International is a worldwide conservation organisation concerned in preventing species decline and extinction. Currently it has launched an appeal entitled 'The Lark Descending' to save the east African Liben Lark from extinction. It is quite shocking, should one log on to its website, to learn how many world species are on Red Lists, due not only to changing climate patterns but also to over population, loss of habitat through over development and predation. The recent extreme flooding in many areas of the populated continents and the decline of sea ice in both polar regions are causing alarm worldwide. The recent COP 29 (Conference of the Parties) has been commented in the press as 'not fit for purpose', and the fact that it was held in Baku, Azerbaijan where oil and gas exploration started, was a strange choice. COP 30, to be held in Brazil, will hopefully be more constructive, especially as the rain forests (the Lungs of the World) are getting near to tipping points due to deforestation, mining developments and increasing human populations, and it has recently been raised in the media about whether the last indigenous tribes can survive. Remember that December 21st is "Robin Day" for our national bird, so put out some Christmas treats for them. Let us all make New Year Resolutions to improve our environments and to discover Nature again for our children in 2025. **Otis Tarda**

As said by many, we are very fortunate to have an extensive network of rights of way in and around our village. It's crucial to keep them open and accessible and so the Parish Council has set up a Rights of Way Working Group.

Landowners and householders have a legal duty to ensure that a right of way on or bordering their land is kept unobstructed and open for use at all times. This includes not putting obstructions on or across the route, such as permanent or temporary fences, electric fences, walls, hedgerows, padlocked gates or barbed wire. They are also required to maintain gates and stiles and make sure vegetation doesn't encroach onto the route from the sides or above bearing in mind the different users, including horse riders. Disturbance of the surface of routes eg by cultivating is also prohibited, as is fly-tipping such as dumping waste or vegetation from their land onto a route. and the Parish Council can request the removal of any obstruction, or it can remove the obstruction and recover the cost from the landowner. In the event a person and/or animal sustains injury, the landowner could be held liable.

There have been recent reports of motor bikes riding on rights of way. Under Section 34 of the Road Traffic Act 1998 it is an offence to ride a motorbike on footpaths and bridleways unless they have permission from the landowner. If you know who is doing this, please would you remind them, as not only is it dangerous and unsafe for them, but very frightening for people and animals. Public footpaths are only open to walkers.

The Rights of Way Working Group would like to lighten the load for landowners where we can in ensuring that paths and bridleways are accessible as possible, and so are looking for people to help by joining in with a working party. It's often just a case of going along with secateurs and other lightweight tools for a couple of hours. The more village people who can help with this the quicker we will make the routes accessible for people and animals and we warmly invite you to join us to ensure the accessibility of these routes, make new friends, have your say, share skills and support the community, for the benefit of us all.

A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

Many residents have asked me why we aren't recycling our food waste like some other authorities in the UK. In short, when the Environment Act was updated in 2021 with a requirement for councils to collect food waste and flexible plastics (film lids and cellophane), we were midway through a recycling contract and were granted an extension until the end of 2026 when the contracts end.

We are approaching the early stages of procurement for new contracts and so those of you who are keen to be recycling more will be pleased to hear that we will be building food waste collections and flexible plastic recycling into our recycling programme from 2027 onwards.

Incorporating food waste and flexible plastics is something we have no choice to do, it is mandated by central government, however, building it into our current operation is likely to cost an additional £2.4m every year! Wiltshire Council's Waste and Recycling Team was therefore tasked with looking at opportunities to accommodate Government policy, improve recycling rates and reduce costs for residents. This led to the testing of various alternative options for recycling from 2027 onwards.

Some local authorities force residents to separate every type of material into different stackable boxes or bags, but our research showed the participation rate is lower because it is too onerous. In fact Basildon has just given up with their 6-container recycling method and is scrapping the whole idea. At the opposite end of the scale, some councils have experimented with a single bin for all recycling, including glass, but found the mechanical sorting ineffective and too expensive (£1.8m extra cost per year).

The solution approved by Wiltshire's Cabinet on the 19th November is the right balance for the environment, budget and residents. From 2027 we will introduce one extra wheeled bin in order to separate paper and card from the current process. 10% of households already have this extra recycling bin, so they will see no change other than to use one for paper and card and the other for plastic and cans. For anyone lacking space for a wheeled bin, an alternative weighted sack will be available.

Doing this will significantly lower the recycling reject rate (the amount of recyclable waste that doesn't make it through the process due to contamination) from 22.5% to just 4.9% and will save local taxpayers three quarters of a million pounds every single year. The significance of saving £750k versus having to spend an extra $\pounds 2.4m$ is massive; this money can be reinvested into our communities through additional road maintenance, town centre development, education or adult social care.

The key message is that there is no change to bin collections or recycling procedure for another few years, for now it is business as usual!

Trees in our landscape - why do they fail in storms? Can you help?

High winds can see the failure of trees due to saturated earth, a top-heavy canopy or a compromised root-system; other factors include soil type, infection, pests and diseases (such as Ash Die Back), grey squirrel damage and lack of maintenance. In the last two years we have seen an increase in flooding within our village and the surrounding area, with a geology of green sand we have seen land slips in Canada Woods and Parsonage Lane and several trees losing their grip on Spin Hill. When tree roots are saturated, it can cause root decay and if this continues long term then the tree will be deprived of oxygen and will die. Trees can draw up a surge of sap into the canopy which can see the tree top heavy and therefore vulnerable to high winds. Ivy in the tree canopy was thought to be a significant problem but is not now thought detrimental to a healthy tree. The Arboricultural Association say "Ivy is an attractive habitat for insects and invertebrates and consequently bird and animal life can benefit as a result of an increase in available food source. Bats, which are rare and protected by law regularly roost amongst ivy, as well as inside small cavities in suitable trees. It would therefore depend on the main aims of the managers of the land in question as to whether the ivy is removed from the trees, or it is left to provide a wildlife benefit."

Market Lavington Parish Council would like your help in reducing the chaos brought about by falling trees during the winter. There are signs a tree may be failing and likely to be brought down in a storm and if you notice any of them, please inform the parish council in any of the ways listed below. If the tree is not on Parish land, then it can also be reported on the My Wilts App. The Parish Council can also liaise with any land owner whose trees are showing signs of failure near roads and footpaths. A resident earlier this year informed the Parish Council of trees leaning over the road on the corner, opposite Drove Lane and the land owner has acted. Signs to look out for: -

- Deadwood or falling branches
- Roots near water
- Missing bark or deep marks canker
- Fungus on the roots and around the base of the tree
- Cracked or raised soil around the base of the tree heave
- Cracks in the trunk
- Unbalanced trees those pruned/managed on one side only

Trees most likely to fall in high winds are conifers, evergreens and older deciduous trees with shallow roots, for example willow.
