Comments from local residents during consultation for the 2021 Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan.

It's time to consider how the village should evolve over the next 10 years.

Change is always a challenge. We all have our views on traffic, on where new housing can best be accommodated, on what's to be done about footpaths, shops, transport, nature, coping with climate change, how we look after those who need help the most.

A neighbourhood plan is not the solution to everything. But it provides a legal basis for change that reflects local views, ambitions and concerns. Its duty is to help deliver sustainable development as part of the overall planning framework.

* "We need homes to bring people with young families into the village. Without adults in their late 20's to 40's we won't have people to volunteer to run clubs, fetes, events etc. Without young people schools, guides, scouts etc will close."

Comment from local residents during consultation for the 2021 Market Lavington Neighbourhood Plan. But to deliver real and practical local credibility, it must be prepared by the community that lives in, works in and uses the neighbourhood.

We are finalising plans for an initial package of community engagement over the next two-three months. Learning from as many as possible – newcomers and old-timers, young and old – its purpose is to identify key issues and themes that will inform the vision and aims of the Neighbourhood Plan.

There will be more engagement as the new

Neighbourhood Plan takes shape. We know the ideas are there. The opportunity is for all of us to try and make it a future that works now, over the next 10 years and beyond!

Mine is the most recent to have been inscribed. I am number 79. Someone else will follow. It serves to make one feel small rather than important.

The first name is that of Herman, whose day falls this month on 20th February. A native of Lorraine (in north-eastern France), Herman was made Bishop of Ramsbury in 1045. He resigned in 1055 when King Edward the Confessor refused to allow the transfer of the see to Malmesbury. He became a monk at Saint-Omer (in northern France), returning to England in 1058 to become Bishop of Sherborne while at the same time being restored to the bishopric of Ramsbury. By 1071, Herman was old and infirm and wished to resign but Archbishop Lanfranc urged him to stay on. There was a plan. Approval of the transfer of the see was given at the Council of London in 1075, thus creating the new diocese of Salisbury, to which you belong. Herman oversaw the initial construction of the Cathedral at Old Sarum but died before its completion, on 20th February in 1078.

Herman would have known where you live and known and cared for your patch of the diocese. A diocese is only the sum total of its parts, and whilst it is the Anglican model of apostolic local leadership, the real strength of mission and ministry is to be found in the local, just as Jesus' ministry was locally based and exercised. We all follow in the footsteps of those who have carried the flame of faith before us in each place. It is that faithfulness, mirroring the fact that God if faithful, that has sustained our communities down the ages, however much the times and the names change. And God will continue to do so, because He is faithful. Stephen, Bishop of Salisbury

Apparently, there are around 500 different varieties of delicate white petalled plant. A true galanthophile will be able to tell a 'Ding Dong' from a 'Heffalump'. Don't ask me, though. I just like the things. It's always a joy to see multitudes of them in bloom along the banks of the B3098 on the way to West Lavington. A favourite winter walk for the wife and me is through the Somerset village of Mells. You can pick up a path alongside the Mells Stream that will take you past the ruins of Fussell's Iron Works. Around this time of year, you will find snowdrops a-plenty springing up in front of the old furnaces that loom high over the path.

Snowdrops are an early promise that the arid deadness of winter will pass. Soon there will be daffodils and tulips. Spring will have sprung. In the meantime, the humble snowdrop is a little reminder of the beauty of creation. We don't simply live in a world that provides us with the bare necessities of life (as Baloo might put it), but a world that fills us with delight. After all, you can't eat snowdrops, which are poisonous to human beings. But who would be without them?

The Christian faith teaches us that God created our world to display his wisdom, power and goodness. The snowdrop is a wonderful example of his handywork. Yes, we live in a fallen world that is twisted and broken, but there is still much that is beautiful for us to behold. The purity of the snowdrop stands in contrast with the grubbiness of human greed, hatred and cruelty. None of us is free from the taint of sin. We see the goodness of God revealed most wonderfully in that he sent his Son, Jesus Christ to die in our place to cleanse us from sin. As Isaiah the prophet almost said, "Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as [a] snow[drop]"





Usually when I am sending entries for the magazine it is to advertise Nestling Trust events or campaigns to help us in our work in Nepal. This time it is to simply to thank you.

The help and support we receive from so many is amazing. Just last year we were able to provide:

- Vital equipment for a Health Post in an area of Western of Nepal devastated by an earthquake.
- Warm dry clothing and clean drinking water in slum areas of Kathmandu, following floods that swept across 72% of the country.
- Funds to maintain a Children's Home built and established in 2018, by the Trust to provide a safe caring environment for destitute//trafficked girls.
- Support and equipment for Health facilities established by the Trust in the remote village areas of Dolakha where previously no medical care was available.
- Equipment and emergency vehicle access to the Baiteshwor Health and Birthing Centre built and established by the Trust in collaboration with the Nepal government.

We also launched an appeal via The BigGive to establish in 2025, an outreach Health Education Programme from the Baiteshwor Health and Birthing Centre. It will extend to three other remote village areas, the total population being approximately 26,000 people.

The response from the BigGive appeal was fantastic – our target figure was £16,000 and in fact we raised £16.546!

A huge thank you to all who donated, and to all those who support us in any way, we are immensely grateful; because of your help, we have been able to help those in desperate need in one of the poorest countries in the world – thank you.

News from Dauntsey Academy Primary School

What a wonderful start to our new term – some snow! There is nothing more lovely to take off the chill of playground duty than watching the children play in the snow! From sliding down the banks to making snow balls and snowmen, they absolutely made the most of the cold snap we have seen in the past few weeks.

I always enjoy January, albeit not the dark mornings and evenings! The reason I love this month is that two of my favourite events happen within the same fortnight – Grandparent's Tea and Young Voices concert.

Grandparent's Tea

At DAPS, we love our children's grandparents almost as much as the children do! We enjoy welcoming some grandparents regularly as a part of everyday school life doing the morning drop offs and after school pickups. Some also help out at school regularly which is invaluable to the day to day life of DAPS but some sadly live too far away to be a regular visitor so our grandparent's tea event not only celebrates those who we see often but also those we don't. As with every year, we welcomed over one hundred grandparents, some travelling great distances to be here. They are greeted by our wonderful pupil school leaders who escort them to their grandchild's class and here they get to meet the class staff and their grandchildren's friends. They spend forty five minutes in class, working alongside their grandchild and any friends whose grandparents couldn't make this year, before making their way into the school hall for a very welcome cup of tea and slice of cake. At this point, our Young Voices choir perform a number of their songs and fill our hearts with joy. There is something really special about having so many children singing together and having rehearsed together since September, the sound is really something.

It really was a wonderful afternoon and we would like to thank everyone who was able to join us, those who helped by baking and those who helped by manning the teapot!

Young Voices

Taking that group of over fifty pupils up to the O2 in London is going to be extraordinary. They have met weekly since the start of September at an after school club and more recently at a lunchtime club to learn the songs and dance moves and the time is nearly upon us when we will take the trip to our Capital city to take part in Young Voices. It is a day at the O2, coming together with up to eight thousand other pupils from schools around the country to rehearse together, ready to take part and perform in a professional concert in the evening. The band is live, the professional performers are amazing and it is an experience like no other.

Pond makeover

Our wonderful PTA team spent last year raising funds for the school and we are delighted to be in the position to be able to start our pond renovation project. In the bottom corner of our field, we have a very overgrown pond, with a sad looking broken jetty which has been out of bounds to the children for many years. I am delighted to say that this will all be changing as our pond receives a makeover it desperately needs with new lining, a new path around it, a new dipping jetty for the children to access the water along with some new fencing. The project will either move forward in the Easter or Summer holidays and I look forward to sharing an update as work begins.





Dog owners responsibilities.

Mans best friend provides so many of us with love and companionship. The only down side of having these wonderful dogs in our life is picking up their mess. It is though part of owning them.

We are receiving more complaints about dog mess than ever on The Clay, The High Street, local footpaths but even more so, the Elisha Field. The Elisha Field is our designated recreation ground, used by all ages of children, families, football teams and other organisations.

It is also a wonderful space for dog owners to give their pooches a really decent run which is vital for an animals health and wellbeing. The Elisha Field is however NOT a litter tray and it is an owners responsibility to supervise and pick up mess. Wiltshire Council has a Dog Control Order for public spaces protection, making it an offence [under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 2016], not to clean up dog mess in certain areas. Under those orders, a person who doesn't clean up after their dog may face an on-the-spot fine of up to £80, or if taken to court and found guilty, fined up to £1,000.

This is a simple ask. If you have a dog please keep an eye on it and pick up its mess.

Market Lavington Parish Council.

Clearing up after your dog helps prevent the spread of some nasty infections and diseases. Dog mess can contain roundworm parasites which cause Toxocariasis in humans. It is spread from animals to humans through contact with infected faeces. Toxocariasis symptoms include dizziness and nausea, asthma and epileptic seizures. It can even lead to serious eye damage or permanent blindness. Dog mess also harbours parasites that can harm farm animals especially cows and sheep.

A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

As your local councillor I am often asked about the state of the highway so I thought it might be helpful to write about Wiltshire Council's investment in our roads, and how spending is prioritised.

Wiltshire Council is evidence-led, with prevention and early intervention in all service areas from Adult Social Care and Children's Services to Highways. Last year we were able to invest an EXTRA £22m into Wiltshire's roads – to put that into perspective, we only received £20.7m from Government for highways maintenance, so we have more than doubled the national budget. Many councils across the country can't afford to spend anything more than the Government's contribution because they have placed themselves in a precarious financial position through poor management. Wiltshire residents are seeing more resurfacing and repairs, and fewer potholes, a fact that has been picked up by both the national press and the DfT, who have both made comparisons of councils across the UK.

In addition to increasing investment we are using new machines called Bobcats, which can remove and replace large areas of road in a matter of minutes, before moving on to the next job. This is far better than the quick temporary involving cold-lay tarmac we have used in the UK for too long.

Now I know what some of you will be thinking... what about the stretch of road between the crossroads in West Lavington and the entrance to Market Lavington, or indeed the stretch between Market Lavington and Easterton! It is worth mentioning how work is prioritised:

All Highways investment follows an evidence-led, risk-based approach. The continuous inspection regime determines the risk to motorists and residents and considers the classification of the road and the amount of traffic it receives (A roads seeing far greater usage and potential risk than B and C roads, for example).

There is a rolling Highways Maintenance Programme for Wiltshire split by Area Boards, available to view on the Wiltshire Council website. I'm pleased that the Devizes area plan includes the B3098 in Market Lavington / Easterton (2025/26), Fiddington Clay/Hill (2025/26) and Kings Road in Easterton (2025/26). The £22m additional investment would not be possible without the Council's careful financial management (which also allowed me to promote Black Dog Crosswords for additional funding). There is much more to come as we continue to invest significant sums into replacing and extending the life of our road surfaces, preventing flooding, replacing road signs and reinstating and painting new road markings. I will continue to keep you updated on the Highways programmes and as always, please do use the My Wilts app to report any local issues.

Market Lavington has an outstanding network of ancient footpaths and bridleways within the parish and linking villages thanks to it having had a weekly market since 1254. These routes were established because people travelled locally, and further afield for commerce, farming, socialising, faith and recreation. These rights of way are as much a part of our shared heritage as ancient cathedrals, castles, henges and hillforts. Poet Geoffrey Grigson described them as humankind's "oldest inscriptions upon the landscape". Market Lavington Rights of Way (RoW) Working Group would like to ensure these are kept and make them more accessible so everyone can freely enjoy them all year round for exercise, routine travel to neighbouring villages and to connect with nature. 


