Election of Churchwardens

No nominations received or volunteers for the role, which remains vacant.

Electoral Roll.

Carol Treloar (Electoral Roll Officer) confirmed the updates to the 2024 Parish Electoral Roll. Rev'd Marion Harrison advised that Electoral Roll will go online in the next few months. In 2025 the current Parish Electoral Roll is due for refresh. Carol Treloar has advised that she will be standing down from the position of Electoral Roll Officer and we would like to record our thanks to Carol for all the work she has done in this role over the last several years.

The Building

Rev'd Marion Harrison provided an update about faculty applications, covering internal re-ordering, viz: Removal of Pews, Removal of Plasterwork (retrospective Faculties granted). Also applications for removal of block of Pews at rear of the Church Nave, re-location of the Font from the west end of the Nave, to a new position by the north door and an application for an exploratory trench adjacent to the external north wall, to understand the condition of the wall footings, prior to development of a French drain concept along the north wall of the Church. An artist's impression for the interior of the Church, following internal re-ordering has been received from our Architect and will be displayed on the Church notice board in the porch.

Other items of work that have been identified during 2023, include remedial work to the Vicar's Vestry roof, which will need to be undertaken by a specialist team and this work is likely to incur significant cost to fix the roof. Also leaks in the Choir Vestry roof and in the main Nave roof above the Pulpit have been identified as needing attention. The Bier house roof needs work to be completed along with removal of part of the Bier house enclosure railings, which have fallen into disrepair and now represent a hazard. The tower stairs are a significant health and safety concern and we have received various quotes to either repair the wooden over-steps (short term fix) or repair the stone stairs (long term fix). The need to check and remove debris from around the tower and to seal the bell chamber and prevent bird ingress is also important work that needs to be completed, in order to prevent further degradation of the tower, as well as enable work to be completed on the bells. This work, along with the need to re-align the guttering and the need to check the roof, would require the erection of scaffolding to the south side of the tower and to the north side of the Nave for a period of time.





Nurture Nature

Some readers have asked where they might catch a glimpse of Crested Tits and Bearded Tits. You won't see them on your bird tables or feeders locally. One is unlikely to see the Crested Tit anywhere in the British Isles, except in Scotland. The Spey Valley pine forests provided a sanctuary for them and they have now spread to Grampian and Sutherland. For Bearded Tits go to Titchfield Haven on the Hampshire Coast. Reports so far indicate that warbler populations are down again this year. Chiffchaffs were once pretty widely spread and were one of the first species to arrive. Not so this year, so far. Hirondininae are also well down in numbers, and who has heard a Cuckoo this spring? Anyone who is lucky enough to hear a Nightingale, please post the info on your local Facebook and inform your County Orni Website. Other species of the tit family which formerly were visitors to gardens and used to enjoy the food in bird feeders are Marsh and Willow Tits, they are difficult to tell apart. Coal Tits too are in decline. On the positive side it was pleasing to see families of Long Tailed Tits on feeders during the colder spells last winter. Referring to warblers, as mentioned above with Chiffchaffs, numbers are down again this year. Blackcaps, Garden Warblers – both beautiful songsters – have hardly been heard. Warblers, such as Sedge, Reed, Willow and others formerly regularly seen on hedgerows, along water courses, in field hedgerows and woods, are in decline. As reported in previous articles, there has been a dramatic decline in bird numbers and species since the 1970s, the BTO has further reported that between 2016 and 2021 UK bird species declined by 46%. Readers can find more information and how to help to stem the tide in species decline at www.bto.org/biodiversity-loss. Should you wish to know more about how birds are faring worldwide, go to www.birdlife.org. "Everyone likes birds. What wild creature is more accessible to our eyes and ears, as close to us and everyone in the world as universal as a bird?" (Sir David Attenborough, Broadcaster). Enquiries have been made about Nightjar migrants, but these are unlikely to be seen or heard locally. Nightjars fly silently and then suddenly start clapping their wings in display and making long drawn out churring noises on warm summer nights. Staple Plain and Stock Hill Woods in the Quantocks in Somerset and the Forest of Dean in Gloucestershire have been haunts for Nightjars having migrated 6,000 kilometres from Central Africa. Still, warm nights in June are perfect for seeing and hearing Nightjars – try Staple Hill in the Blackdowns, Staple Plain in the Quantocks, Stockhill on Mendip, or Webber's Post on Exmoor. Another migrant which may be mistaken for a Nightjar, though not of the same family, is the Wryneck, a species of the Woodpecker family. However, they are becoming very rare and one would be very lucky to see one. The writer has only seen one, a juvenile, in a semi rural Wiltshire garden in the 1970s.



Salisbury Railway Station embarks on extensive forecourt makeover

Extensive improvement works have begun on the forecourt at Salisbury Railway Station to create a more welcoming first impression to the city and be more accessible for visitors and residents.

The £5.8 million scheme will take approximately one year to complete with continuous access to and from the station throughout the works.

The redevelopment of the station forecourt will result in the temporary loss of all standard pay and display parking on the forecourt for the duration of the works. The parking at the western end of the car park will remain open. Alternative parking will be temporarily available at Central Car Park, approximately a 7-minute walk away. Existing short-stay parking is being changed to long-stay parking to support rail customers, until the new temporary station car park on Fisherton Street, next to the Royal Mail Salisbury Delivery Officer is opened, later this year.

Market Lavington Parish Council has been served by Colin Osborn for 13 years as a Councillor, and led by him for 12 years as Chair. We owe a significant debt of gratitude to him for his constant commitment to the role over those years. Dedicating his time, energy and on occasions I'm sure, his patience.
