A Gift to the Church

I write this the day after the funeral of the Rt Revd Mark Santer, former Principal of Westcott House Theological College, and Bishop of Birmingham, theologian, and pastor. Mark ended his life and ministry in this diocese, with permission to officiate he continued to serve these last few years in the parish church of St Aldhelm's, Branksome. His funeral at the church was a wonderful celebration of a life well lived, of his rich ministry and the gift of friendship which so were in receipt of.

We have just under four hundred active retired clergy in the Salisbury diocese. Priests and deacons who have not only served for many years in stipendiary or self-supporting ministry in dioceses right across the Church of England and overseas, but who are willing to continue to offer their talents and experience to us here. Bishop Andrew and I with our secretaries manage the renewal of their permission to officiate every three years, and new safeguarding training and DBS checks are part of this. This is a tremendous commitment and a gift to the church for which we must be truly thankful. We also, as bishops, meet all those retired clergy moving in to make sure they feel welcomed and supported with ongoing support offered through our network of deanery retirement officers, and diocesan retired clergy officer. Many of our retired clergy are involved in active ministry in their local church, as well as taking funerals and weddings; others offer spiritual direction, mentoring and coaching or act as reviewers for our ministry review scheme or as deanery and diocesan retirement officers, regularly staying connected with those with PTO and retired clergy who are inactive. This is all a very real reflection of the fact that God continues to use us in many and varied ways throughout our life. Indeed, Bishop Mark preached his final sermon on Easter Sunday at the age of eightysix!

1st October is the International Day of Older Persons. A day to celebrate the gifts of all those who continue to show us the love of God through their generosity, positivity, and humility. If you include yourself here, thank you!



Confessions of an ex-cyclist

The lime green Raleigh roadster was deposited without ceremony at Warminster recycling centre. Destined for a new life in India, apparently.

I wasn't much of a cyclist anyway. I don't think I've ever knowingly worn Lycra. My top speed was probably achieved as a paper boy. A dog I regularly encountered in Tredegar Street, Rhidwerin would snap at my pedals until the road went downhill on entering my home village of Bassaleg near Newport. Eat your heart out, Geraint Thomas. With apologies to Orwell's Animal Farm, for me, it's a case of "two legs good, two wheels bad." Cyclists may object. Oh, well. For their sakes, my wife and I must repeatedly stop holding hands to let them whizz past when we're strolling along the Kennet & Avon towpath.

And my point is? Oddly, that freedom is a precious thing. Cyclists are free to get on their bikes, while I'm free never to get in the saddle again. Old married couples and two wheelers may groan at the sight of each other on the K&A, but neither party owns the towpath. We just have to give each other a bit of space to do our own thing. Now, freedom has limits. I'm not at liberty to push cyclists into the canal as they pedal past. Cyclists aren't free to run into us if we're a bit tardy getting out of the way. Similarly, the law does not give us liberty to incite violence against others. As keyboard warriors who made incendiary comments during the summer riots have found to their cost.

But with all the necessary qualifications in place, in a democratic society, we need to be able to say stuff that other people may find objectionable or even offensive. Christians shouldn't have a problem with that, as we don't believe people can be coerced into the kingdom of God. We demand no aid from the state when it comes to advancing or defending our beliefs. Our God requires no blasphemy laws to protect the honour of his name.

The truth is best served by making space for an honest and forthright exchange of views, even when some of those views are despised by fashionable opinion. Otherwise, you end up with a vicious cycle of intolerance and repression. Freedom withers, truth is sacrificed. As Jesus himself once said, 'You shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free.'



We hope all our children who moved on to school have settled in Reception class and we wish them all the best as they begin the next step in their learning journey.





Nurture Nature October 2024

A lovely day today in mid September as I write this month's article. Soon landscapes will be festooned in beautiful spiders' webs. Garden birds are emerging from their moults and one can often spot the discarded feathers. Unhappily, due to further decline in our British bird numbers continue in a downward spiral year on year. One hardly saw a starling or a house sparrow this year on feeders, or foraging on lawns and veg patches. It will be interesting to see what numbers constitute this autumn's murmurations – so fascinating to hear and see overhead in places such as Chirton Gorse and Marden Cowbag near Salisbury Plain, and also around Slimbridge and Cam. Readers have reported that some of the songsters contributing to dawn choruses are absent this year, even the ubiquitous and well loved national bird, the robin, are in decline. But this autumn it is noticeable that robin numbers are down, meaning that they no longer have to sing from dawn to dusk in order to announce 'this garden is mine'. It is estimated that there are seven million robin territories in this country. Incidentally, Vera Lynn's song about a nightingale singing in Berkeley Square, was more likely to have been a robin, as they will sing in towns where street lighting means they have to be alert at all hours. Last month I wrote that I would say something about rooks. Rooks are gregarious and noisy birds, and tend to join jackdaws to form very large flocks which are quite a spectacle when they do one of their mass 'fly overs'. Not confined to the countryside, they can be found anywhere there are tall mature trees in which to build their messy nests, which they have to repair each spring, often attempting to bring sticks which are so large and unwieldy that they end up dropping them. They will eat pretty much anything, including small birds and mammals, and will mob birds of prey too. Like all corvids they are crafty and their 'rookeries' can be very large and distinctive, and are often in use for years, sometimes decades.

The UK government is planning to appoint a special envoy for nature for the first time, as the foreign secretary, David Lammy, seeks to put the UK at the centre of global efforts to tackle the world's ecological crises.

Labour will also appoint a new climate envoy, after the Tories abolished the post over a year ago, a move that dismayed foreign governments and climate campaigners.



A Message from Cllr Dominic Muns Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons

Housing developments are always sure to divide opinion. I write this having attended the Eastern Area Planning Committee at the Corn Exchange in Devizes this afternoon where the Long Field development of up to fourteen houses and a new Co-Op store was just approved for Market Lavington. Strong and balanced representations were made by the Chair of the Parish Council and members of the public who reflected the varied feedback residents gave during numerous meetings. If you were present at the local planning meeting earlier this year you will know I called the application to committee because I felt it needed the added scrutiny and opportunity for further debate given the balance of support and opposition across the parish. Whether you are disappointed or pleased with the decision, I don't think any of us can say that we weren't given the opportunity to have our say in what was a very transparent process.

When developments go bad (not the title of a new Channel 5 series – although I could point producers towards a fair amount of content), residents suffer. For this reason, transparency, engagement and respect between those responsible for developments and those living around them is so important.

A couple of weeks ago as parents and students (less so teachers!) were excitedly awaiting the start of term, the pedestrian crossing outside the Hayfield site sat unfinished. Despite having the entire summer to complete the works, the developers failed in their efforts with various excuses given. To add insult to injury, as the works were abandoned at the eleventh hour, the trench dug across the road was not adequately filled and several vehicles hit it and damaged their tyres. To cut a long story short, the developer has been read the riot act and is expected to complete the works during the October half term.

Sadly, the impact of a developer not taking responsibility for delivering what they were conditioned to do two years ago stretched well beyond the cost of a few tyres. One morning during the start of the new term, a young lad who should have had a nice new light-controlled crossing to aid his journey from West Lavington to Market Lavington on his way to school, instead crossed the busy road a little further up the hill and was hit by a car.

Thankfully the youngster was not seriously injured and the driver, who was not in any way at fault, came to their aid along with others who witnessed the incident.

This accident serves as a stark reminder that planning conditions are imposed for good reason and in the interests of public safety, they should <u>never</u> be neglected.
